	18th.		B. Squadron (dismounted) occupied inner line of Canal defences at Serapeum, East Bank. C. Squadron (mounted) occupied Devoson Post on Canal.	
	23rd.		Lieut (Temp. Capt) W. J. McLaughlin and Lieut D. W. Hamray transferred to 4th Infantry Battalion.	
	25th.		B. and C. Squadrons rejoined Regiment, having landed over their Posts to Infantry of 4th Brigade.	
	27th.		4 Baggage Waggon, 16 horses and 8 Drivers taken over from end Light Horse Brigade train.
