24.10.16	DERNANCOURT	Batt ⁿ moved at 1300 to POMMIER CAMP. Weather was very bad - camp in a bad state & insufficient accomodation for men, many of whom had to sleep out.	AMIENS $\frac{1}{100,000}$ LENS $\frac{1}{100,000}$
26.10.16	POMMIER CAMP.	On account of bad accomodation, batt ⁿ moved back at 1200 to billets in ALBERT where there were plenty of good billets.	
29.10.16	ALBERT	Batt ⁿ left ALBERT at 0800 & marched to BERNAFAY CAMP. Roads very bad & on account of this & excessive traffic, did not arrive until 1315. Moved again at 1500 to relieve 88 th Brigade of 29 th Division. Guides were to meet platoons at Brigade H.Q. - but were very late. Whole batt ⁿ was to move into line A & B Coys to take over CREASE TR. - A from WORCESTERS - B from NEWFOUNDLANDERS, C Coy to take over HILT TR & D CHEESE TR. & GUN PITS. Guides provided did not know routes & as a result platoons wandered all over the place & the companies got into line in small parties relief being completed at about 0500 on the 30-10-16. ^{No Casualties.}	FRANCE 57 C S. 30.10.16		Two platoons ^{of C Coy} were withdrawn into BOOT TRENCH at near Batt ⁿ H.Q. at N 26 D.O.O. All benches & comman ^o were in very bad state, in many parts mud being up to thighs & weather very cold.

30.10.16	GUEDECOURT	<p>Enemy's shelling was not heavy - practically none at all on front line - but a fairly constant barrage in & around GUEDECOURT - through which ^{barrage} all ration parties had to pass.</p> <p>All projected operations had to be postponed on account of state of ground.</p> <p>At 2200 that evening B Coy's bombing post on end of CREASE-TRENCH took 1 off & 6 other prisoners.</p>	
31.10.16		<p>Work was carried on as much as possible on all benches. Rain continued & made much work impossible.</p> <p>at 2200 A Coy took two prisoners & B Coy fifteen.
