

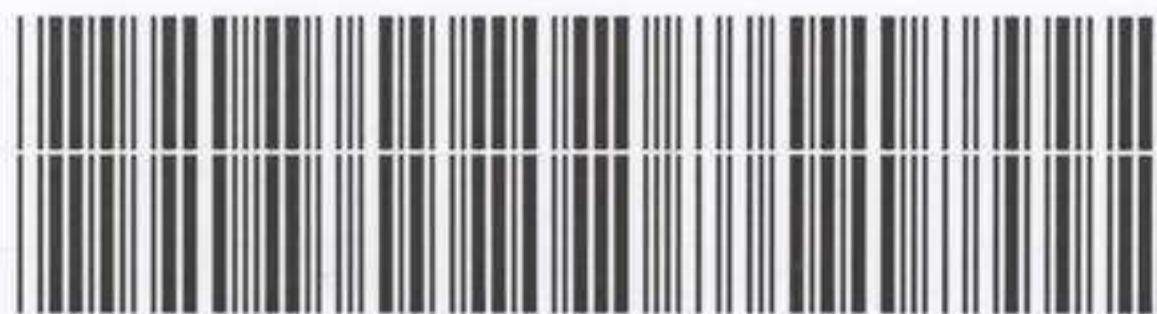

1916 Nov 29	Jenny Post	Route march to Brighton beach road head, about 7 miles, commencing at 0520. Men in full marching order & carrying blankets - March discipline excellent - Wellington (N.Z.) L.H. provided tea for all ranks at Rail Head at 0800 Arrived at ROAD HEAD at 0945. Had to wait in broiling sun until 1600 for tents, owing to transport difficulties.
