

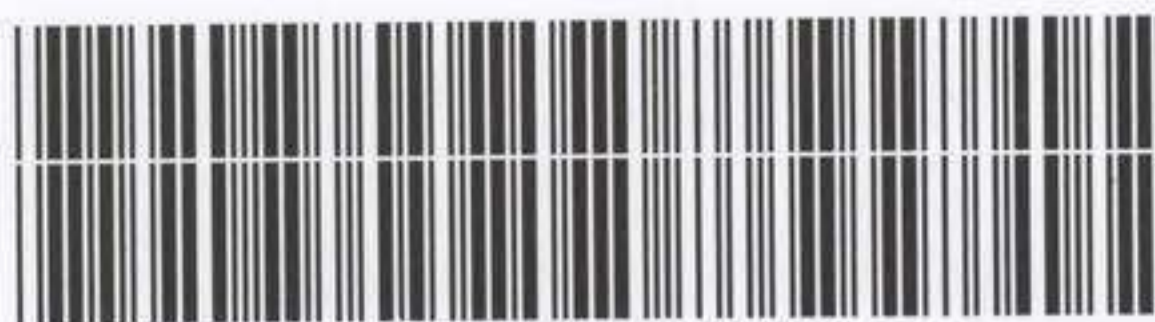

	7th	1045 to 1430	Battalion marched to North eastern outskirts of MOREBECQUE and received instruction in use of Gas helmets and demonstration of gas cloud and effect of Tear bombs. Regimental Transport arrived from ABBEVILLE	See Ap. A.1. See Ap. A.2
	8th	1115 2015	marched with Brigade Group to ESTAIRES via CROIX MARAIS and MERVILLE arrived and bivouaced at DOULIEU

ROUGE DE BOUT	13th	—	Battalion absorbed in fatigues to front line trenches.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	14th	—	Battalion engaged on fatigues in front line and communication trenches. Bde. Hdqrs. moved 500 yards South West along Laverie Road.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	15th	0530 to 1230	C.O., 2nd Lt. in Command, O.C. Companies and all available officers visited front line trenches. Preparations made for assault on enemy trenches tomorrow. Major Elliott detached to Bde. Hdqrs.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	16th	—	Preparations made for assault on enemy trenches tomorrow. Major Elliott detached to Bde. Hdqrs.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	17th	—	Attack postponed owing to unfavourable weather which prevented effective artillery action. Gas alarm 11 p.m. Capt. Hewitt reported for trench duty vice Major Elliott at 1900.

ROUGE DE BOUT	18 th July	—	Capt. Hewitt returned to his unit. Major Elliott reported back for duty. Further preparations made for postponed assault, now fixed for tomorrow. 60 th Bn. detailed in Brigade Orders as A Bn. in attack.	
TRENCHES ON FROMELLE'S FRONT.	19 th	—	Coy. Cmdr and all other available officers received final instructions re assault at Bata. Hdqrs. at 10 a.m. Zero time 11 a.m. Head of Battalion moved past Brigade Hdqrs. at 1.30 and marched via V.C. Sap to front line trenches under heavy enemy artillery bombardment. Friendly artillery very heavily bombarding enemy trenches. Battalion established in front line trench by 4.30, Lewis guns excepted, after casualties having occurred, some serious. At 6.45 Battalion scaled parapet and advanced in four waves, the first wave leaving at 6.45, the last at 7. The advance each wave advanced under very heavy artillery, machine gun and rifle fire, suffering very heavy casualties. Advance continued to within 90 yards of enemy trenches. The attack was held up although it is believed some few of the Battalion entered enemy trenches. During the night 19/20 a few stragglers, wounded and unwounded, returned to our trenches.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	20 th	—	60 th Bn. relieved by 57 th . at 7 a.m. and survivors returned to former billets. Roll call held at 9.30 a.m., 4 officers and 61 other ranks being present. Bata. concentrated in one billet 200 yards N.N.W. of Brigade Hdqrs. Orders received 20 reinforcements to arrive at 6 p.m. Postponed.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	21 st	—	20 Reinf. reported to Bata. Hdqrs. at 10 a.m. 2/Lieut L.H. Pender attached as acting Adjutant. Bata. under Lieut. Kerr as acting C.O. Search parties searched "No Man's Land" and brought in wounded.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	22 nd	4 p.m.	Major Duggan attached as temporary C.O. Search parties brought in dead and wounded.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	23 rd		Battalion resumed ordinary duties. Supplied Bata. fatigues. Capt. Cameron attached as temporary 2nd i/c. Search parties brought in dead and wounded. 2 officers, 103 other ranks reported as reinforcements. 2/Lieut. Diamond attached. Reinf. officers, 2/Lieut. Savage and 2/Lieut. Bover. 2/Lieut. Geach & 39 other ranks took over WINTER'S NIGHT POST.

ROUGE DE BOUT	24 th		2nd Lieut Bowen detached to 57 th for instructions in trench duties. 2nd Lieut Savage relieved 2nd Lieut Geach at WINTER'S NIGHT POST. Battalion engaged on ordinary routine.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	25 th		2nd Lieut Arter reported for duty. Battalion engaged on fatigues in morning. Battalion reorganised into companies in afternoon.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	26 th		Under Bde. instructions 2nd Lieut Savage relieved at WINTER'S NIGHT POST by 2nd Lieut Geach, and attached to 58 th Battalion for instructions in trench duties. Battalion engaged mostly on fatigues. Training of bombing teams recommenced.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	27 th		Battalion engaged on fatigues to trenches and supply dumps.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	28 th		Battalion engaged on fatigues. 2nd Lieut Diamond relieved 2nd Lieut Geach at WINTER'S NIGHT POST. Platoons at WINTER'S NIGHT POST relieved and strength reduced to 33 other ranks.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	29 th	0600 to 1500	Battalion engaged on fatigues. At 1600 moved to RIFLE VILLA and relieved B1 Coy 58 th Battalion. 58 th Battalion relieved WINTER'S NIGHT POST and 60 th fatigued at 1800. 1st Lieut ^{2nd Lieut} Geach and 2nd Lieut Arter with 90 other ranks moved into 300 yard line to assist 59 th Bn. ROUGE DE BOUT	30 th		2nd Lieut Diamond relieved 2nd Lieut Geach in 300 yd line at 1000. Remainder of battalion on fatigues to firing line and 300 yd line. Training of bombers continued.	
ROUGE DE BOUT	31 st		Major H. M. Duggan in command of 59 th and 60 th Bns. temporarily amalgamated for trench defence purposes. Battalion in 300 yd line and on fatigues.
