		1	Cpts. F.H.McNamara and A.E.Geere posted to Squadron as Flight Commanders from No. 67 Squadron, A.F.C., Egypt.	
		5	2/Lt. W.King posted to 48 R.S., Waddington near Lincoln, for instruction.	
		17	A Wing Boxing Tournament was held tonight and this Squadron did very well. The Lightweight championship was won by A/M Dutton S. A/M Goode M. the runner-up won the cup donated for the most scientific boxer. The Middleweight championship was won by 1/AM Arbrew J., and Sgt. Hartman was only beaten on points in the final of the Heavyweight.
