Castle Bromwich. England	1917 July 1-31		Squadron utilised for training purposes. Graduated 15 Officers and trained 9 service Pilots.
		5	No. 1078 1/AM Merritt A.J. recommended for Meritorious Service Medal for making a gallant attempt to save Lieut. J.K.Fletcher from a burning aeroplane. Though severely burned himself Merritt stuck to his task of releasing the Pilot until he was overcome by the fumes and fell exhausted. The Pilot was burned to death. Lieut. J.K.Fletcher burned to death in aeroplane accident.
		6	The undermentioned 20 candidates for commissions as Pilots in A.F.C. selected from the rank and file of the Squadron left for London to report to S.O. A.F.C. A.I.F. Headquarters. F/Sgt. Courtney J.C. F/Sgt. Bate A.G.T. F/Sgt.
