ENEMY VESSELS CAPTURED IN AUSTRALIAN PORTS

Steamers detained in Port Jackson at outbreak of war:—

- German-Australian Line.—*Melbourne, Osnabrück, Sumatra.*
- Hansa Co.—*Stolzenfels.*
- C. Andersen's Line.—*Tiberius.*
- Jaluit Co.—*Germania.*

Detained at Newcastle:—

- Oceana Line.—*Wotan.*

Detained in Port Phillip:—

- North German Lloyd Line.—*Pfalz.*

Detained at Brisbane:—

- German-Australian Line.—*Cannstatt.*
- North German Lloyd Line.—*Prinz Sigismund.*

Detained at Port Huon:—

- German-Australian Line.—*Oberhausen.*

The following vessels reached Australian ports after the outbreak of war, and were seized on arrival:—

- Aug. 5. *Scharzfels* (Hansa Line), at Port Adelaide
- 6. *Greifswald* (North German Lloyd), at Fremantle.
- 11. *Hobart* (German-Australian), at Port Phillip Heads.
- 15. *Lothringen* (North German Lloyd), at Melbourne.
- 18. *Wildenfels* (Hansa), at Port Phillip Heads.
- 21. *Berlin* (German-Australian), at Sydney, and *Altona* (same line), at Melbourne.
- 23. *Signal* (M. Jebsen), at Brisbane.
- Sept. 3. *Hessen* (North German Lloyd), at Melbourne.

The Austrian vessel *Turul*, of the Hungarian Levant Co., was detained in Port Jackson on August 7th, after the declaration of war against Austria. The *Neumunster* (German-Australian) and *Thüringen* (North German Lloyd) were captured on the high seas by the *Pioneer*, and brought to Fremantle. Five sailing-ships must be added to the list—the *Athene*, detained in Port Jackson; the *Carl Rudgert Vinnen*, *Susanne Vinnen*, and *Olinda*, detained at Newcastle; and the *Ernst*, which on the 11th of November, ninety-nine days after the declaration of war, came placidly in through Port Jackson Heads.
