The Australian War Memorial will host the national Remembrance Day Ceremony on Wednesday, 11 November. OB vans are welcome to the Remembrance Day ceremony with prior arrangement.

- **Remembrance Day Ceremony, 10.15am, 11 November 2009**

Commencing at 10.15am, the national Remembrance Day ceremony includes a minute's silence at 11am to remember the moment 91 years ago when the guns of the Western Front fell silent after more than four years of fighting. The ceremony is a special opportunity to reflect on the sacrifice of Australian servicemen and women on the anniversary of the end of the First World War.

The Australian War Memorial will open to the public after the ceremony is finished.
