Dear Brendan.

I hope all is well; I am involved in a project quite separate from my work with the Gurkhas and I have just returned from UK meetings with the MOD, Department of Sports, Media and Culture (WW1 commemorations), Sir Steve Redgrave and the Stewards of Henley Royal Regatta on the centennial of the 1919 Royal Henley Peace Regatta.

The objective is a once off world class international sporting event in 2019 involving military crews from eight nations against a backdrop of Henley Royal Regatta, British Royalty, political and societal change makers. A100 year commemoration of peace, achievement and athletic excellence with a firm focus on the future.

Aside from the racing infant of 100,000 spectators, there is also to be a Ball in aid of military

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charities and an event not dissimilar to the Gurkha Challenge event last year - of which I sent you a video on that rather solid USB.

I am in Canberra later in the month as part of the RAF 100/ AAF 97 celebrations on the 22nd. Might you have any time either side of that for a quick brief including video footage? I think there are compelling reasons why you might consider a visit to Henley Royal Regatta 2019.

You may also be able to assist with two associated questions:

Firstly, although we will have to fund a 'new' Kings Cup, I would also like to see presentation medals provided to all the competitors, if things go to plan, by HRH The Prince of Wales. Given that Australia won the Kings Cup in 1919, I think that an Australian connection to the medals is important. Ideally I would like to use some WW1 ironmongery or materiel as the base. I have a commercial smelter lined up but am now looking for metal to melt, ideally with a story or connection.DO you have any ideas?

Secondly, Dave Thomson is the UKGOV lead on WW1 commemorations, I have the contact leads for his equivalent in France, US, and Canada. Who has led this in Canberra?

We will cover the Kings Cup, the Australian Victoria Cross publication and Private O'Hea VC. I will forward the appropriate contacts after the meeting

I am commissioning participant medals for the 2019 race from Fattorini, who also hold a Royal warrant. The design will be based in part on the 1919 medals and composition of the medals will be materiel from each of the participating nations. I envisage this to include that from major battle sites including the Western Front and Gallipoli as well as more contemporary battle sites.

Given that there will be a story behind each contribution I am minded to ask if each nation's war memorial/ museum can source and record the contributions, be it from Regiments or the museums themselves. It would be helpful to nominate a lead institution to pull this together. Given the Australian connection to the event in 1919, would the AWM like to take this lead? 



Dear Brendan,

it is tremendous to see the Kings Cup in the War Memorial exhibition 'After the War' especially given the events taking shape next year at Henley Royal Regatta. You run an amazing world class facility.

After the briefing you attended at the British High Commission you may be interested in the attached address I gave to the Chiefs just prior to the Invictus Games.

On the AWM exhibition might it be possible to revisit the Kings Cup display itself please? I know your researchers are brilliant but the photograph is not that of the crew that won the event in 1919 and the write up is almost wholly inaccurate, confusing Henley Royal Regatta with Royal Henley Peace Regatta, the genesis of the event and even the origins of the crew with those who represented Australia in the 1912 Olympics.

With the ADF now committed to representing Australia in 2019 alongside seven other nations it would be a shame to let the current display stand. The involvement of Winston Churchill and the diversion of the Kings Cup from the oarsmen to a nascent AWM is a story I would also have liked to seen aired.

If I can assist in any way, please let me know. I also believe you have a rather splendid oar from the race in the collection - perhaps there might be space for that also?


In respect of our earlier communication on the prizes and potential materiel, I have written to the Governor General and mentioned our previous correspondence. The Government of Canada are contributing copper roofing from their first Parliament building on the basis that their armed forces protect Canadian values, way of life and institutions; the Kiwis are contributing brass fittings from the boat that actually raced in the 1919 as well as service buttons from all the major New Zealand campaigns and; the Germans have presented brass fittings from their Navy sail training ship with a nod to the future and peaceful endeavour as well as some interesting history which includes war reparations and the involvement of a U Boat Commander. I am yet to hear what the Palace will contribute but the medal design is simply stunning and I hope there will be a place for one in the AWM collection in due course.

Address to the joint Chiefs at The Kings Cup dinner, Invictus Games Sydney 2018

The Kings Cup at Henley Royal Regatta 2019 is a military rowing race first run 100 years ago at the Royal Henley Peace Regatta when crews from Australia, New Zealand, USA, UK, France and Canada competed.

The 2019 stage is the iconic annual Henley Royal Regatta in Henley-on-Thames, UK. A highlight of the British summer, the Regatta ranks alongside Wimbledon, Ascot and Glyndebourne. Her Majesty the Queen is Patron and this 180 years young event is part Edwardian picnic, part elite sporting event. Over five days in front of 100,00 spectators and broadcast cameras, races include schools, universities and national crews.

The Kings Cup at Henley Royal Regatta will be a race between eight military forces which honours the past, cements and contributes to the Alliances of today and builds towards the future; Germany and the Netherlands will join the original six nations each representing their armed forces and racing in gender inclusive crews.

The Kings Cup is also a trojan horse for a sport with tremendous military potential and a proxy for a much bigger conversation on bridging an emerging gap between the military and broader society, using the power of sport.

Militarily we live with a new normal of persistent conflict with agile, persistent and disruptive adversaries, an increasingly siloed world, with fragmented society and uncertainty for many. This is a difficult environment for military organisations to balance effectiveness with social licence, inspiration with military discipline, rapidly changing technologies with societal impact, personal accountability with State objectives.

In many nations, uniforms are now seen as a hazard rather than worn as a source of public pride and civilians often have little comprehension of the role of the modern soldier. Some are challenged by diversity and whilst an adversity is gender blind and we all understand that oestrogen is an essential component of successful treaties, many still struggle with women on the front line. Increasingly and thankfully, prior contributions are becoming more recognised but service does not always mean sacrifice and not all veterans are victims.

As we know, battles are won long before force of arms are deployed and keeping the peace requires a healthy, celebrated, respected and fully funded force of arms. New ways to hearts and minds are required.

Which all amounts to today being a dangerous place for armed forces to survive, let alone thrive. Patently some of our nations are doing better than others but we all need events that help build allies and alliances, experiences that strength our human potential and engagements that build societal and political capital.

Into this melee comes the Kings Cup, a small but impactful and positive contribution to society and the critical role that the military plays in keeping it internationally civil. The Kings Cup is a force multiplier:

The first time men and women will row in the same boat at an elite international event
The first time in 100 years that we will have a military event at Henley Royal Regatta
The first time 120 Allies from eight nations will be living, racing and rowing together
The first time there is to be a major international sporting event in the wake of British Armed Forces week
The first time in 600 years that Cutlers Livery Company apprentices will work with Goldsmiths' apprentices
The first time eight Nations will contribute meaningful materiel into alloyed Kings Cup medals and prizes
The first time there is the possibility of a 100 Year Peace Ball at Henley Royal Regatta

Signed off by the Chiefs, supported by Heads of State, this is a military rowing race with impact. As much as a journey for eight Allies as it is a military race: The Kings Cup at Henley Royal Regatta 2019.

Background on the objects the Australian War Memorial will gift to Rowing Australia for the King's Cup medals

REF: 2022-23-14

The Australian War Memorial will contribute original brass door fittings from the tower of the main building that was dedicated on Remembrance Day 1941. These door fittings were replaced on doors during the First World War gallery refurbishment in 2013 and provide a direct link to the original Memorial which was the inspiration of Official War Correspondent and Official War Historian C.E.W. Bean. In 1948 Bean wrote, "Here is their spirit, in the heart of the land they loved; and here we guard the record which they themselves made."

The Australian War Memorial will also contribute a piece of the bronze plate used in casting the Rolls of Honour that record the names of over 102,800 Australian servicemen and service women who died during or as a result of war service, or for Post-1945 conflicts, warlike service, non-warlike service and certain peacetime operations. The Rolls of Honour record the names of nearly 62,000 servicemen and service women who died during and immediately after the First World War of 1914-1918 in the service of their nation.
