Last Post Ceremony

At the end of each day the Last Post Ceremony is conducted in the Memorial's Commemorative Area. Each ceremony honours one of the more than 103,000 servicemen and servicewomen whose names appear on the Roll of Honour.

As traditionally occurs on 11 November, the eulogy for the Unknown Australian Soldier, first delivered by the Honourable Paul Keating in 1993, will be read at today's ceremony at 4.45 pm.

Mr Kerry Stokes AC

Kerry Stokes has given extraordinary service to the Australian War Memorial across 15 years, from 2007-2022, as a member of and Chairman of Council. Mr Stokes guided the organisation through a period of significant commemoration, in the establishment of the Official Histories project for East Timor, Iraq and Afghanistan and the commencement of the Memorial's current expansion to tell the stories of veterans who served Australia over the past 30 years.

In addition to Mr Stokes' role on Council, his personal contributions include donations of items to the National Collection, featuring a number of Victoria Crosses and the Thuillier Collection of First World War photographs featured in the exhibition *Remember me: the lost diggers of Vignacourt.*

In 2015, Mr Stokes was awarded a Fellow of the Australian War Memorial in recognition of his exemplary contributions to the collection, and to the commemorative, exhibition and educative roles.

His consensus-building approach, business acumen, honour and respect for veterans have underpinned his successive terms as Chair and his contributions at Council will be greatly missed. The staff and volunteers, both past and present, express our sincere and heartfelt thanks for his outstanding service and dedication.
