

At the Churchill Club, large and small worlds

The Churchill Club was one of dozens of clubs in London where servicemen and women could spend their recreation leave. Here they could have a cup of tea, write a letter home, and sometimes get a meal or a bed for the night. Stella visited many of these clubs to record the activities of Australian airmen and Australian ex-prisoners of war who had just been released from German camps.
