

About the artwork:

Wendy Sharpe arrived in East Timor in December 1999, in time for the Christmas celebrations which marked the turning point and a new beginning for the East Timorese.

In this work, she records the Christmas Eve concert and re-enactment of the massacre that had taken place in the cathedral earlier in the year. The concert, which Sharpe depicts with drama and emotion, conveyed not only the grief and loss felt by the East Timorese people, but also their appreciation for the assistance provided by Australian peacekeepers during the conflict. Her use of dark, grainy etching juxtaposed against the central space of white light vividly conveys the theatrical atmosphere of the concert.
