Vale Les Carlyon AC 1942–2019

The Council and staff of the Australian War Memorial mourn the passing of pre-eminent historian, author, journalist, and long-serving Council member Mr Les Carlyon AC.

Les Carlyon gave our nation many gifts. He was a recipient of two Walkley Awards and numerous other awards for journalism. Perhaps his greatest contributions were his book *Gallipoli* and its successor volume, *The Great War,* recounting the story of Australian forces on the Western Front in France and Belgium, for which he was awarded the inaugural Prime Minister's Prize for Australian History.

Les Carlyon had a towering impact on the deliberations of the Council of the Australian War Memorial. When he spoke, all would listen, reflecting the respect in which he was held and the wisdom of his contribution.

He will be missed, and our thoughts go out to his wife, Denise, and their family.
