in the face of heavy odds on three separate occasions. On the night 7th/8th April 1917 Captain REMAID organised the attack by his Division. Company on the WINDHILL on the BAPAUME-CAMBRAI Road West of BOURSIES, and having moved forward C.O. 12th the plateons he personally and under heavy machine gum and rifle fire led a bombing attack Battalion. up the pain road. Owing to the heavy enemy fire two of his Company Officers became casualties; he then personally rallied the Company and was one of the first into the objective. On the night 8th/9th April 1917, the enemy counter attacked his position at the WINDHILL after a heavy harrigo of smoke bombs and trench mortars. By his wan personal exertions and utter disregard of the keavy enemy fire, he brought up a plateon from the reserve Company and with the remants of his own Company charged the enemy and succeeded in regaining the position. On the morning of the 15th April 1917, Captain NEWLAND was in command of the second company from the left of the Brigade line N.R. of LAUNICOURT. At dawn the enemy attacked in great force overpowering the Company on his left, and entered LAGNICOURT from the N.West, thus taking Captain REWLAND'S Company in rear. Captain HEYLAND at once brought back the left of his Company and beat off a combined enemy attack from three quarters.
