Sisley Huddleston was an English writer who lived in Paris, one of many expatriates living in France between the two world wars. Sisley, Ford and Stella mixed in the same social circles, went to the same parties and spent long afternoons discussing art, literature and politics.

- Why do you think the walking stick is in the drawing? Why are his hands resting on the stick as they are?
- How is Sisley's clothing and appearance different from what men wear today?
